Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As Jesus began his public ministry, he called twelve Apostles to join him. When his ministry was complete, just before he ascended to heaven, he entrusted the mission to go make disciples to the Apostles while granting them his own power and authority through the gift of the Holy Spirit. While the Apostles were called specifically to the ministerial priesthood, they were not without support in their ministry. Many others, men and women, some who were acknowledged by name, and others who remained anonymous, provided support for them out of their means (cf. Lk. 8:1-3). To this day, our Lord continues to call men to himself for the sake of priestly ministry. Likewise, there remains the need to provide support for these men, especially during the time of a man's formal formation within the seminary.

We are currently blessed with 22 seminarians and there are others already applying for the coming year! Without including the expense of operating the Office of Vocations, the education alone - tuition, room and board - costs around \$270,000 per seminarian over the course of his six years of philosophical and graduate level studies in Theology.

In the diocese of Peoria, we do not lament the fact that we are burdened with these costs. Rather, we are thankful that Jesus has called so many men who are willing to enter seminary formation in order to be future priests serving your parishes and families. For this reason, we have chosen to focus attention on this Thanksgiving holiday to thank God for our seminarians and to thank God for all who provide for them.

I ask you to prayerfully consider making a financial donation towards priestly vocations at mass on Sunday, November 27th, the Sunday after Thanksgiving. Your gift will directly contribute to the education of our seminarians. Your generous support is much needed and greatly appreciated. Please make your check available to the Catholic Diocese of Peoria Office of Priestly Vocations.

FOUNDATION 1: EMPOWERING EVANGELIZATION SO AS TO SHARE THE SAVING NAME OF JESUS

We often hear the word “evangelization.” But what does it really mean, and how are we called to evangelize as Catholics? What does evangelization have to do with the Growing Disciples Pastoral Planning initiative?



To dig deeper into this, and into each of the five foundations upon which Growing Disciples is rooted, Bishop Louis Tylka is presenting a series of video discussions with different individuals from across the diocese. In this video, **Bishop Tylka** and **Father Adam Cesarek**, pastor of St. Mary’s Catholic Church in Pontiac, Ill., discuss the following, and more:

- ▶ **Evangelization means bringing the Good News of Jesus into every human situation** and seeking to convert individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself. *(Definition from the USCCB’s National Plan for Evangelization)*
- ▶ **We are all called to evangelize.** But in order to evangelize, we need to first fully experience who Jesus is for ourselves. This involves converting our hearts daily.
- ▶ **National culture and trends regarding religion** are much different today than they were even a few decades ago, so the way that we approach evangelization must change, too.
- ▶ **Through Growing Disciples, we are evaluating how we can be better stewards of our resources** in order to follow God’s call to **go and make disciples** in the way it is needed today.



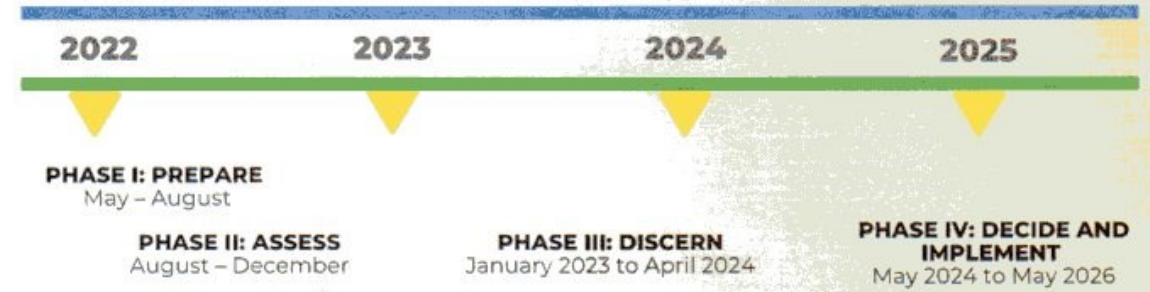
